Winter Casey is a senior advisor for Internet policy at the Department of Commerce's National Telecommunications and Information Administration Office of Policy Analysis and Development, and is a member of the first Department-wide digital economy team. Previously, Casey spent five years at Google where she started and lead Google's trade policy practice. Prior to joining Google, Casey was a journalist in Washington, D.C. for nearly a decade. She spent five and a half years with the National Journal Group largely covering international technology policy issues. Her National Journal magazine story, "Why They Lobby," was featured in the 2009-2010 McGraw-Hill textbook on American government. As a journalist, Casey also wrote for USA Today and The Washington Times. Her international experience includes working for The Council on Hemispheric Affairs, the U.S. State Department International Visitors Program, and Universidad Jose Cecilio Del Valle in Tegucigalpa, Honduras. Casey, who hails from Maine, graduated cum laude from Simon's Rock College of Bard in Great Barrington, Massachusetts, earned an advanced degree from Georgetown Law in Washington, DC, and has served as a visiting scholar at American University, Washington College of Law.
